

**Sociology Department Declaration of Concentration \*\*OPTIONAL\*\***

The sociology department now offers seven areas of concentration for our undergraduate majors, comprising sub-fields for which our department is recognized nationally and internationally. These concentrations are intended to guide students into specializing in areas of particular interest to them and to signal their expertise in these areas to potential employers and graduate schools. A concentration is not required, but is recommended to help students focus their course of study.

Students may only choose one area of concentration. For each concentration, students will take four courses in sociology and related departments, though at least two of the four courses must be taken through the sociology department. If two courses in sociology in a given concentration are not available, students may substitute a course outside of sociology with the approval of a sociology adviser.

Students may also work with an adviser to create their own concentration if their area of interest is not covered in these specializations.
