"In a White Man's Place: Racial Boundaries and Middle-Class Mobility in Three Gilded Age Cities."



Description: The months leading up to the 2024 presidential election saw the widespread use of raceclass archetypes and narratives about the dangers of non-Whites making claims to middle class identities. At the turn of the twentieth century, similar racial projects emerged as White populations in Atlanta, San Antonio, and San Francisco responded to Black, Tejano, and Chinese American men's pursuit of social mobility through public sector employment. In this presentation, I consider what Whites' cultural and legal responses to the changing contours of the race-class nexus during the Gilded Age can tell us about contemporary middle-class racisms.

Joseph O. Jewell is Professor and Head of Black Studies at the University of Illinois - Chicago. His research examines how the race-class nexus is articulated and reinscribed during periods of social change.
